Image information: This work is from the 'Recording Britain' collection of topographical watercolours and drawings made during the Second World War. The scheme was known as 'Recording the changing face of Britain' and was established by Sir Kenneth Clark, then the director of the National Gallery. Over 1500 works were eventually produced by 97 artists. After the war, the whole collection was given to the V&A by the Pilgrim Trust in 1949. The pictures now form a memorial to the war effort, and a unique record of their time.
